Purpose and legal basis of data processing

We use a YouTube channel of Google Ireland Limited, Gordon House, 4 Barrow St, Dublin, D04 E5W5. The purpose of data processing on our YouTube channel is to provide information about products, services, and news, combined with the possibility for users to interact with us in a targeted manner. The legal basis for the data processing is Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is our business interest in sharing information with visitors to the YouTube channel and being able to communicate with them.

Google Ireland Limited, Gordon House, Barrow Street, Dublin 4, Ireland is responsible for the collection and further processing of personal user data on YouTube websites. Please note that YouTube collects and processes certain information about your visit to our YouTube channel even if you do not have a YouTube user account or are not logged in to YouTube. For us as the operator of this YouTube page, only your public profile on YouTube is visible. The information that can be viewed here depends on your settings in your profile. If we publish images of individuals, this is done with the consent of the individuals (legal basis: Art. 6 para. 1 lit. a GDPR), based on a contractual agreement (legal basis: Art. 6 para. 1 lit. b GDPR) or in exceptional cases based on legitimate interests (legal basis: Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f. GDPR in conjunction with § 23 para. 1 no. 3 Art Copyright Act).

YouTube Analytics

We also process your activities on our site with the help of the statistics service YouTube Analytics. This process serves to optimise our site and is consistent with the purpose of data processing described above. Anonymised statistics are created based on your activities. Among other things, we can gain insights into the interactions and activities of our subscribers, the views of our channel, the reach of posts, information on which countries and cities our visitors come from, as well as statistics on the gender ratios, age structures, providers, and interests of our visitors. Neither conclusions about individual users nor access to individual user profiles by the administrator are possible.

Third Country Transfer

Due to the fact that the provider Google Ireland Limited is part of the Google Group, which has its headquarters in the USA, data transmission to Google LLC and thus to all countries in which Google has data centres cannot be ruled out. To ensure an adequate level of data protection, Google Ireland Limited bases such data transfers on the standard contractual clauses of the European Commission.

In this context, we would like to point out that you are using the service provided by Google Ireland Limited (YouTube) and all associated functions such as sharing and rating videos, participating in discussions on your own responsibility. Data that you have voluntarily provided on YouTube will be processed by Google (e.g., name and username, email address, telephone number) and may therefore also be transmitted to third countries. The transmission of personal data to the USA was judged by the ECJ to be fundamentally unsafe without further security measures, as it cannot be ruled out that US security authorities may gain access to this data.
